

The NYS Standard for Protection against Ionizing Radiation (Part 16.6(h)) requires that the dose to an embryo/fetus during the entire pregnancy of a declared pregnant woman not exceed 5 mSv (0.5 rem) due to occupational exposures.

This limit is one-tenth the annual limit for occupational exposure. To benefit from this limit, it is required that female employees formally notify the employer of pregnancy in writing.

Please complete the section below and return to the Environmental Health and Safety Office if you choose to make this voluntary notification. Pregnant women will be supplied with their own dosimetry badge that must be worn at all times when working in radiation areas.
